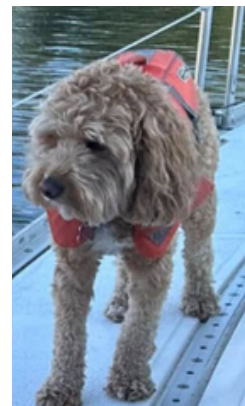
Happy New Year DYC Members!

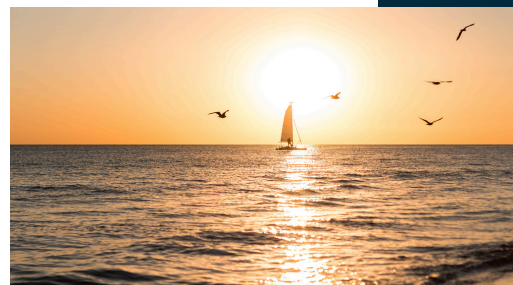

My husband Tom and I have been members since 2021, with our first boat 'Namaste'. A 26 foot Four Winns. Since then, we got the foot-itis and moved up to our boat 'HELOC'. A 37 foot cruiser that calls B Dock its home.

We first became interested in joining the club through conversation with Mike and Connie (Fool'n in the Rain). We were a transient for a night or two back in 2021 and they spoke so highly of the club we decided to look into joining. The rest as they say, is history!

Starting off the season with the sailpast is definitely one of our favourites. But we have also really enjoyed the Commodores Ball. It is great to see everyone (we don't see often enough) all done up for a night out.



Our first boat was my first foray into anything sailing. My husband, a mariner of over 45 years, had to teach me literally everything. There are no rights and lefts on our boat. Nor a bathroom or a bedroom. There is however a starboard and port, a head and a berth.

When I am not on the water, my job is with **Niagara's Mobile Closet**. A not for profit organization that is committed to bringing new/gently used clothes and other daily essentials to the unhoused and low income in our community. An organization born out of the pandemic, the team of volunteers creates free shopping events throughout the Niagara region. The events are no questions asked and the goal is to have people's basic clothing and hygiene necessities met with compassion and dignity.

Our organization has also created what we call 'mini closets'. Front line crisis service agencies are provided with a structure filled with clothing and shoes to help bridge the gap for anyone in emergent need. Currently there are 21 throughout the region in places such as the hospitals, police stations and EMS buildings, with big plans next year to add 4 more.

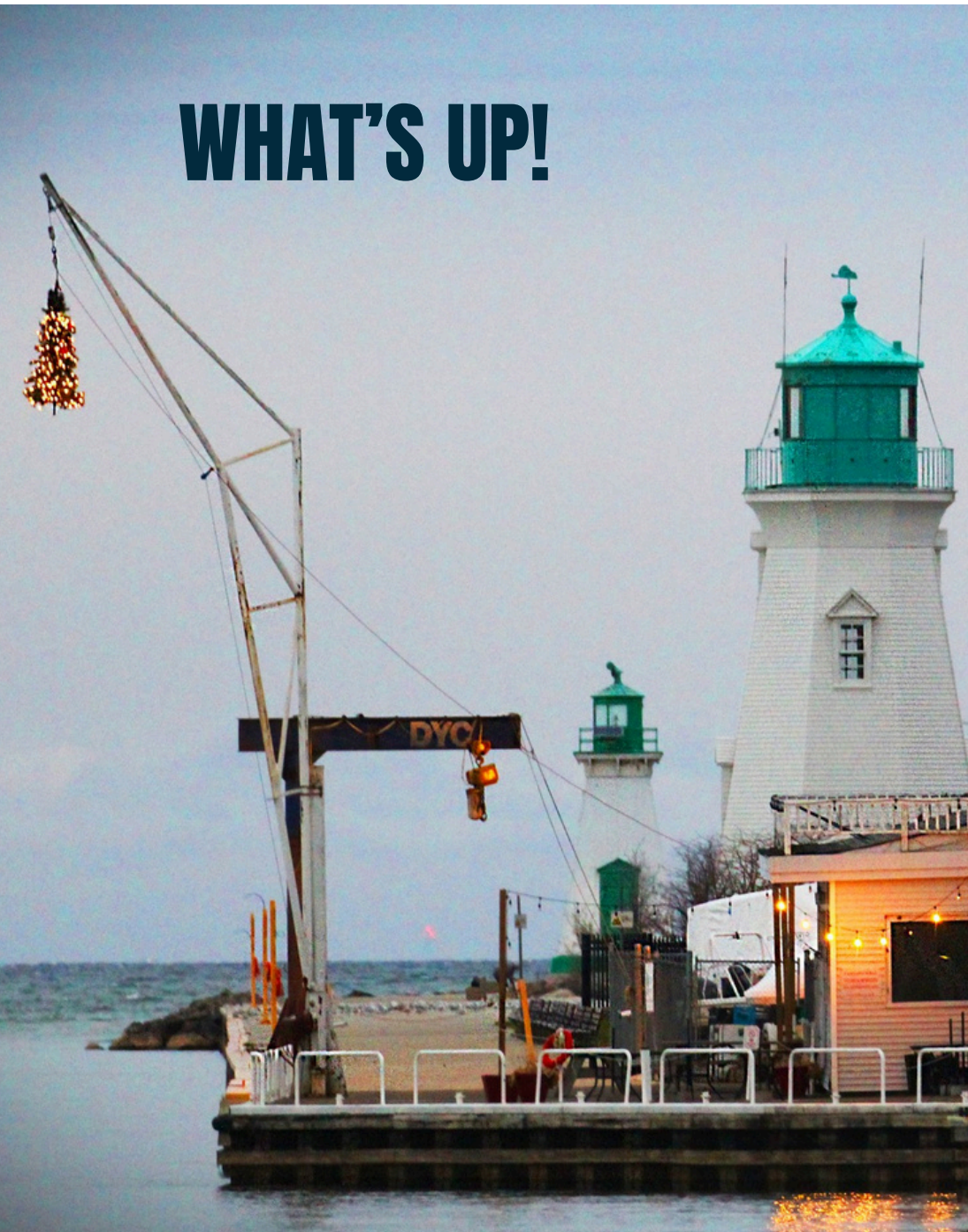

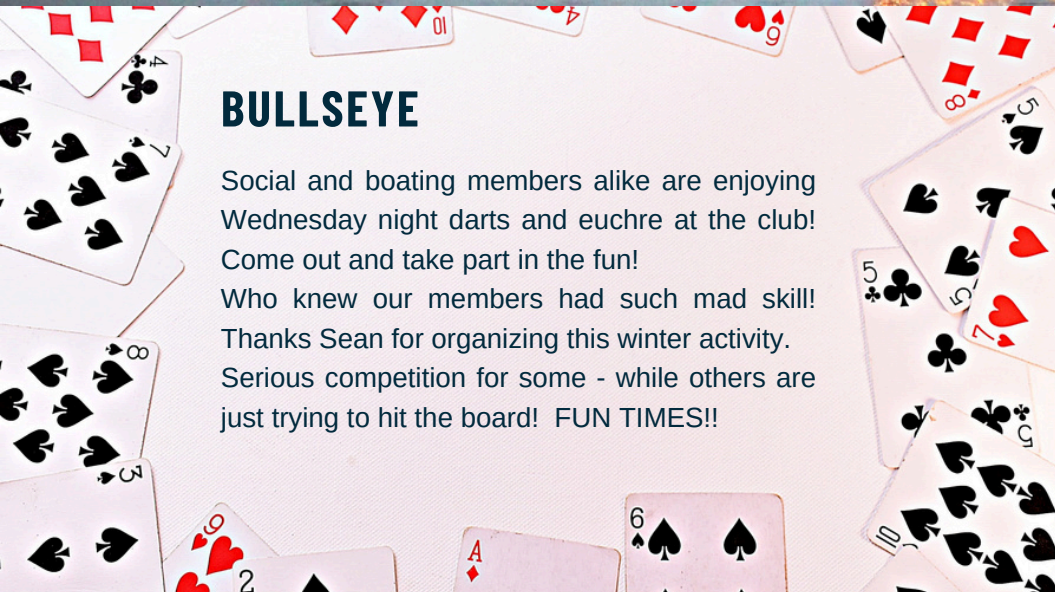

DID YOU KNOW ?

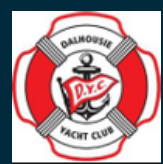
